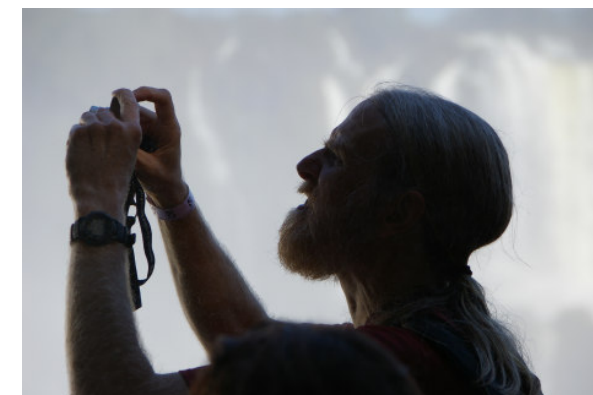

## Cross-Cultural brain injury rehabilitation

---

### Contents:

Brain injury rehabilitation is a cultural activity that is usually unfamiliar to those entering it. They will typically try to relate it to a familiar experience. When such participants come from a culture different from the host culture, rehabilitation providers need to make extra efforts to understand the individual, family, and community they hope to serve in order to be successful.

This workshop will cover institutional and rehabilitation team policies that can contribute to successful cross-cultural brain injury rehabilitation, and focus particularly on the work of psychologists in that context. Topics covered will include dimensions of culture most pertinent to neurorehabilitation, researching the client's culture, working with interpreters, taking a cultural and linguistic history, understanding and working with family and community, goal-setting, independence vs. interdependence, overprotection, mental health and disability stigma, attribution of disability and emotional problems, cultural understandings and expectations of healing and rehabilitation, sources of knowledge and authority,

means of teaching and training, and adapting neurorehabilitation techniques to different cultural contexts. The workshop will emphasize an approach that uses everyday activities and natural helpers from the client's social context to facilitate recovery. This approach includes developing a rehabilitation perspective, collaborative goal-setting, the functional analysis of target activities, finding appropriate natural helpers, and training helpers in encountering the right level of challenge and in how to supply help and training. There will also be an emphasis on applying neuropsychotherapy concepts and techniques in different cultural contexts. This will emphasize developing workable conceptualizations of the problems; an emotional rehabilitation perspective; collaboration among the individual, family, community, and professionals; exploiting the natural strengths, resources, and authority of the social context; the role of religion; and integrating rehabilitative and psychopharmacological approaches. These themes will be illustrated with case examples and vignettes.

### Vita

**Tedd Judd** received his B.A. from Princeton, his PhD from Cornell, and postdoctoral training in neuropsychology at the University of Washington. He is Board Certified in Clinical Neuropsychology by the American Board of Professional Psychology, a Fellow of the National Academy of Neuropsychology, a Certified Hispanic Mental Health Specialist, and President of the Hispanic Neuropsychological Society. He is adjunct clinical faculty in psychology at the University of Washington and adjunct faculty in psychology at Seattle Pacific University.

He has worked in adult clinical neuropsychology for 29 years, and currently is in private practice in Bellingham, Washington. Much of his work has focused on traumatic brain injury rehabilitation. He has taught neuropsychology in 21 countries on 5 continents, including a Fulbright Senior Lectureship in Spain and two years of teaching in Costa Rica. He has a specialty in cross-cultural neuropsychology, and an interest in the development of culturally appropriate neuropsychology in developing countries.
